ORDINANCE: CHAPTER 75 All-Terrain Vehicles and Snowmobiles

CHAPTER 75 ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES AND

SNOWMOBILES 1. Purpose

1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to regulate the operation of all-terrain vehicles and snowmo-

biles within the City. 2. DEFINITIONS. For use in this chapter the following terms are defined:

1. "All-terrain vehicle" or "ATV means a motorized vehicle, with not less than three and not more than six non-highway tires, that is limited in engine displacement to less than 1,000 cubic centimeters and in total dry weight to less than 1,200 pounds and that has a seat or saddle designed to be straddled by the operator and handlebars for steering control.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 32111)

2. "Off-road motorcycle" means a two-wheeled motor vehicle that has a seat or saddle designed to be straddled by the operator and handlebars for steering control and that is intended by the manufacturer for use on natural terrain. "Off-road motorcycle" includes a motorcycle that was originally issued a certificate of title and registered for highway use under Chapter 321 of the Code of Iowa, but which contains design features that enable operation over natural terrain. An operator of an off-road motorcycle is also subject to the provisions of this chapter governing the operation of all-terrain vehicles.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 32111) "Off-road utility vehicle" means a motorized vehicle, with not less than four and not more than eight non-highway tires or rubberized tracks, that has a seat that is of bucket or bench design, not intended to be straddled by the operator, and a steering wheel or control le-vers for control. "Off-road utility vehicle" includes the following vehicles:

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 32111) "Off-road utility vehicle - type

1" includes vehicles with a total dry weight of 1,200 pounds or less and a width of 50 inches or less.

B. "Off-road utility vehicle -type 2"includes vehicles, other than type 1 vehicles, with a total d1y weight of 2,000 pounds or less and a width of 65 inches or less.

"Off-road utility vehicle - type 3" includes vehicles with a total dry weight of more than 2,000 pounds or a width of more than 65 inches, or both

An operator of an off-road utility vehicle is also subject to the provisions of this chapter governing the operation of all-terrain vehicles.

"Snowmobile" means a motorized vehicle that weighs less than 1,000 pounds, that uses sled-type runners or skis, endless belt-type tread with a width of 48 inches or less, or any combination of runners, skis, or tread, and is designed for travel on snow or CODE OF ORDINANCES

SHEFFIELD, IOWA

ice. "Snowmobile" does not include an all-terrain vehicle that has been altered or equipped with runners, skis, belt-type tracks, or treads.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 32JG.1) 3. GENERAL REGULATIONS. No person shall operate an ATV. off-road motorcycle or off-road utility vehicle within the City in violation of Chapter 3211 of the Code of lowa or a snowmobile within the City in violation of the provisions of Chapter 321G of the Code of Iowa or in violation of rules established by the Natural Resource Commission of the Department of Natural Resources governing their registration, equipment and manner of operation. (Code of Iowa, Ch. 321G & Ch.

3211) 4. OPERATION OF SNOWMO-

BILES. The operators of snowmobiles shall comply with the following restrictions as to where snowmobiles may be operated within the City:

1. Streets. Snowmobiles shall be operated only upon streets that have not been plowed during the snow season and on such other streets as may be designated by resolution of the Council.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 32JG.9[4a]) 2. Exceptions. Snowmobiles may be operated on prohibited streets only under the following circumstances:

A. Emergencies. Snowmobiles may be operated on any street in an emergency during the period of time when and at locations where snow upon the roadway renders travel by conventional motor vehicles impractical.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 32JG.9[4c]) B. Direct Crossing. Snowmobiles may make a direct crossing of a prohibited street provided all of the following occur:

(1) The crossing is made at an angle of approximately 90 degrees to the direction of the street and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing;

(2) The snowmobile is brought to a complete stop before crossing the street:

(3) The driver yields the right-ofway to all on-coming traffic that constitutes an immediate hazard: and

(4) In crossing a divided street, the

crossing is made only at an intersection of such street with another street. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 32JG.9[2])

3. Railroad Right-of-Way. Snowmobiles shall not be operated on an operating railroad right-of-way A snowmobile may be driven directly across a railroad right-of way only at an established crossing and notwithstanding any other provisions of law may, if necessary, use the improved portion of the established crossing after yielding to all oncoming traffic.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321G.13[lh]) 4. Trails. Snowmobiles shall not be operated on all-terrain vehicle trails except where so designated. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 32JG.9[4fl)

5. Parks and Other City Land. Snowmobiles shall not be operated in any park, playground or upon any other City-owned property without the express permission of CODE OF ORDINANCES SHEFFIELD, Iowa

the City. A snowmobile shall not be operated on any City land without a snow cover of at least onetenth of one inch.

6. Sidewalk or Parking. Snowmobiles shall not be operated upon the public sidewalk or that portion of the street located between the curb line and the sidewalk or property line commonly referred to as the "parking" except for purposes of crossing the same to a public street upon which operation is authorized by this chapter.

5. OPERATION OF ALL-TER-RAIN VEHICLES. The operators of ATVs shall comply with the following restrictions as to where ATVs may be operated within the City:

1. Streets. ATVs and off-road utility vehicles may be operated on streets only in accordance with Section 321.234A of the Code of lowa or on such streets as may be designated by resolution of the Council for the operation of registered ATVs or registered off-road utility vehicles. In designating such streets, the Council may authorize ATVs and off-road utility vehicles to stop at service stations or convenience stores along a designated street.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321110[1 & 3]) 2. Trails. ATVs shall not be operated on snowmobile trails except where designated. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 321110[4])

3. Railroad Right-of-Way. ATVs shall not be operated on an operating railroad right-of-way. An ATV may be driven directly across a railroad right-of-way only at an established crossing and notwithstanding any other provisions of law may, if necessary, use the improved portion of the established crossing after yielding to all oncoming traffic. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 321114[lh])

4. Parks and Other City Land. ATVs shall not be operated in any park, playground or upon any other City-owned property without the express permission of the City. 5. Sidewalk or Parking. ATVs shall

not be operated upon the public sidewalk or that portion of the street located between the curb line and the sidewalk or property line commonly referred to as the "parking."

6. Direct Crossing. An all-terrain vehicle or off-road utility vehicle may make a direct crossing of a highway provided all of the following occur:

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321110[5]) A. The crossing is made at an angle of approximately ninety dearees to the direction of the highway and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing.

B. The all-terrain vehicle or offroad utility vehicle is brought to a complete stop before crossing the shoulder or main traveled way of the highway.

C. The driver yields the right-ofway to all oncoming traffic which constitutes an immediate hazard.

D. In crossing a divided highway. the crossing is made only at an intersection of such highway with another public street or highway.

E. The crossing is made from a street, roadway, or highway designated as an all-terrain vehicle trail by a state agency, county, or city to a street, roadway,

or highway designated as an all-terrain vehicle trail by a state agency, county, or city. 6. NEGLIGENCE. The owner and

operator of an ATV or snowmobile are liable for any injury or damage occasioned by the negligent operation of the ATV or snowmobile. The owner of an ATV or snowmobile shall be liable for any such injury or damage only if the owner was the operator of the ATV or snowmobile at the time the injury or damage occurred or if the operator had the owner's consent to operate the ATV or snowmobile at the time the injury or damage occurred.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321G.18 & 321119)

7. ACCIDENT REPORTS. Whenever an ATV or snowmobile is involved in an accident resulting in injury or death to anyone or property damage amounting to \$1,500.00 or more, either the operator or someone acting for the operator shall immediately notify a law enforcement officer and shall file an accident report, in accordance with State law. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 321G.10 & 321111)

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors have the legal right under the State of Iowa Code 21.7 Rules of conduct at meetings; which states, "Nothing in this chapter shall prevent a government body from making and enforcing reasonable rules for the conduct of its meetings to assure those meetings are orderly, and free from interference or interruption by spectators;" and, WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors determines that it is in the best interest to assure the Public Hearings, informational meetings and all meetings conducted by the Board of Supervisors may follow the below principles to allow for orderly and uninterrupted public comments to be made by those at-tending said meetings and/or hearings; and, WHEREAS, Resolution 2022-49 repeals Resolution 2016-27 and adopts this new form of "Franklin County Legislative Rules & Procedures" and establishes that the Board of Su-

Franklin County Legislative Rules & Procedures

1. The Board shall choose a member of the current board to service as chairperson and a vice-chairperson at its first meeting in January. The Board encourages the rotation of the chair and vice-chair positions yearly.

2. The Chairperson shall have the authority and responsibility to maintain the order conduct of business and may restrict public comment in non-public hearings. During public hearings, the Chairperson may direct who has the floor to speak but shall allow each person present to speak if requested.

3. All agenda items, except those requiring a public hearing, shall not allow for public comment unless designated on the agenda that public comment is permitted. The Chairperson has the sole authority to request public comment on any item not designated for public comment.

4. Maintenance of the Board Agenda

a. The agenda for the Board is to be maintained and published in accordance with the Iowa Code by the Auditor. b. An agenda item may only be added by a member of the Board, an elected official, or a department head of this county. c. Requests for an appointment time with the Board shall be filed with the Auditor. Said requests must be made

no later than 4:00PM four (4) days prior to the scheduled meeting date.

d. The length of time for an agenda item shall be set by the Auditor. A specific amount of time may be requested on the agenda request form and shall be communicated prior to the agenda item submission deadline and is subject to approval of either the Auditor or a Member of the Board

e. Agenda Notice – The following items shall be placed at the top of all agendas for the Franklin County Board of Supervisors

i. All meetings are open to the public unless for purposes describe in Iowa Code §21.

ii. Agenda appointments must be scheduled through the Auditor's Office by 12:00PM, no later than four (4) days prior to the meeting).

iii. The "Public Comments" section of the agenda is your opportunity to address items not on the agenda. A

speacker may speak on one (1) issue per meeting for a maximum of three (3) minutes. iv. Official action cannot be taken by the Board during that time, but may be placed on a future agenda or referred to the appropriate department.

v. Keep comments relevant and refrain from personal; impertinent, or slanderous remarks

vi. Questions concerning these rules or any agenda item may be directed to the Auditor at 641-456-5622 vii. Please turn off cell phones during the board meeting.

5. Public Hearings & Public Comment Time:

a. Every attendee must sign-in on the Registration Form provided by the Board before the start of the Board of Supervisors' public hearing, informational meeting or any meeting conducted by the Board of Supervisors in order to be allowed to speak during the public discussion, entitled "Speaker" b. Every Speaker may speak for no longer than three (3) minutes

c. Any Speakers that did not get a chance to speak during the public discussion may write their comments down on the official Public Comment Form and such forms shall be added to the minutes

d. There shall be NO interruptible interaction with attendees or Speakers

e. Speakers and attendees shall be required to direct their comments to the Supervisors of Franklin County at all times and shall be cordial at all times

f. Speakers shall address the Chair of the Board of Supervisors before beginning their public comments

g. There shall be no outbursts, personal attacks, or interruption by attendees or Registered Speakers

h. All legal, active organizations in attendance shall only have one (1) spokesperson speaking on such organizations' behalf

i. Failure to abide by the above Public Hearing, informational meetings and all meetings conducted by the Board of Supervisors rules and procedures shall result in being removed from said meeting. The decision for removal shall be at the sole discretion of the Chair of the Board of Supervisors

6. The Board of Supervisors may act to modify, amend, cancel, or otherwise change these provisions as described at any time

7. The Board of Supervisors may meet any day that requires a Public Hearing, informational meeting and all meetings conducted by the Board of Supervisors where action may be required in the Franklin County Courthouse or other designated facility, at which time and place proceedings will be instituted and possible action taken and at which time and place any and all persons shall have an opportunity to be heard or have the opportunity to write comments in favor of or in opposition.
