For any authorized infrastructure purpose of the school district as defined in Iowa Code Section 423F.3(6); and For the payment of principal and interest on bonds issued under Iowa Code Sections 423E.5 and 423F.4. Public Measure IS for the AGWSR School District

In the AGWSR Community School District, the following Revenue Purpose Statement which specifies the use or revenues the AGWSR Community School District will receive from the State of Iowa Secure an Advanced Visior for Education Fund shall be adopted.
